




Thuringia against Corona – Information on getting vaccinated

Why should I get vaccinated against Covid-19?

The corona vaccination is currently the most important building block for containing the pandemic. It is crucial for returning to a normal life in the foreseeable future.

What happens when a highly infectious person (“super spreader” = S) who is sick with COVID-19 meets **100 people**? *



DESPITE VACCINATION

Observe the “AHA + A + L” rules:

In German, “AHA + A + L” stands for keep your distance (A), observe hygiene (H), wear an everyday mask (FFP2 if possible)(A), use the CoronaWarnApp, air rooms (L).

FACT CHECK

Fact:
An approved vaccine is safe, even if approval is fast-tracked.

Only when the **quality, efficacy** and **safety** of the vaccines have been proven will regulatory authorities grant approval. This is the case with **all** vaccines.

Severe side effects, such as allergic reactions, are extremely rare.

As with any vaccination, reactions and side effects such as fever, tiredness or headaches can occur after the corona vaccination.

Tens of thousands of study participants have already been vaccinated before approval, and many millions of people worldwide have been vaccinated in the meantime.

The **safety** of the vaccines is continuously monitored and evaluated.

How do I get a vaccination appointment?

In Thuringia, there are currently **two ways** to do this.

1. Vaccination at an “Impfzentrum“

Appointments by telephone will be made in German.

INFO Please bring your **✓** identity card / passport or **✓** residence document to your vaccination appointment. Please also bring your **✓** vaccination card (if available) to the appointment.

2. Vaccination at the office of a general practitioner

INFO GP practices are gradually integrated in the process. Talk to your family doctor about this.

IMPORTANT If you live in communal accommodation, you can also ask the house administration about local vaccination possibilities.
